Council Policy: Outdoor Watering Conservation Policy

1. PURPOSE

To improve water conservation and reduce peak water demands during the summer months.

2. POLICY

The City of Merritt has adopted a Water Conservation Strategy which sets out a long-term plan for future water conservation efforts within the City of Merritt. The Outdoor Watering Conservation policy is a part of the overall strategy to reduce peak water demands during times of water shortage and authorizes staff to adjust watering restrictions to appropriate levels informed by the BC Drought Response Plan.

3. OBJECTIVE

Merritt's climate and typically hot, dry summers result in considerable water usage for gardening, watering lawns, etc. It is the intent of the Outdoor Watering Conservation policy to help reduce the draw on Merritt's water supply and heighten public awareness of overall water usage.

4. PROCEDURE

Water stewardship is the responsibility of all residents, and the City of Merritt's Outdoor Water Conservation policy shall be in effect for all users of the City's water system.

Residents will be encouraged to practice water conservation through a broad educational program. The City may implement more extensive water use restrictions as required.

Anyone watering contrary to the regulations may be fined in accordance with City bylaws. The City may suspend, regulate or stop the supply of water to any of its Customers for the use of sprinkling or irrigation of lawns, gardens or fields or for any other use, whenever in the opinion of the Director of Public Works and Engineering Services public interest may require it.

Notices of changes to watering restrictions will be advertised on the City webpage, in the newspaper, on the radio, and by any other means of communication deemed appropriate.

5. EXEMPTIONS

Upon application, the City of Merritt may grant exemptions to watering restrictions as long as the Drought Level is set at a Level 3 or lower. In general, exemptions for new lawns or lawn restoration will be limited to one month of daily watering between the hours of 12-2 am, 6-8 am, or 7-9 pm.
