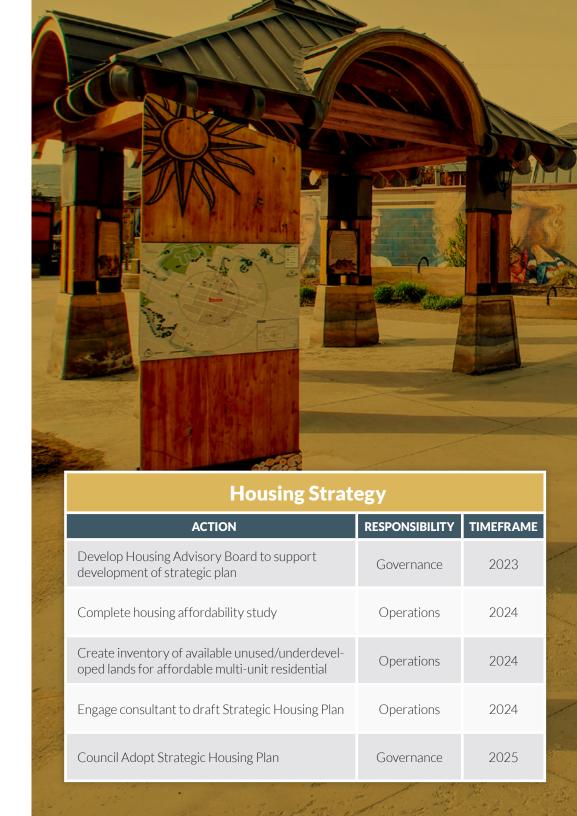


## FLOURISH UNDERTHE SUN

The City of Merritt will be supported by safe, effective and sustainable infrastructure that meets the current and future needs of residents and businesses.

As one of the largest cost centres, asset management is one of the highest priorities for the health of the municipal organization. Asset management is the framework that allows the municipality to take a high level, far-sighted view of the costs of the municipal organization as it relates to tangible capital assets.

The municipality is obliged through legislation to engage in asset management and the City is coming to the end of the provincial grace period for implementation. Failure to implement asset management is likely to have impacts on municipal capital funding going forward.
